### Materials You'll Need:

3. **Create the Bat's Wings:** Cut two pieces of black plastic canvas measuring 2 holes wide and 3 holes tall. For each wing, single crochet around the perimeter, leaving an opening at the top for attaching. Embroider three white lines on each wing for the veins.
4. **Assemble the Bat:** Attach the bat's body to the base canvas by sewing it in place at the center. Then, attach the wings to the body, positioning them slightly above the center.
5. **Add the Hanging Loop:** Cut a piece of black yarn measuring approximately 6 inches long. Fold it in half and insert the ends into the top hole of the base canvas. Tie the ends together to create a hanging loop.
6. **Finishing Touches:** If desired, you can embroider the word "BOO" or other Halloween-themed words onto the base canvas using embroidery floss.

## Tips for Success:

- Use a sharp needle to prevent snagging the plastic canvas.
- Keep the stitches tight and even for a neat and professional look.
- Don't be afraid to experiment with different colors and designs to create your own unique napkin holder.
- If you don't have embroidery floss, you can use a permanent marker to draw the eyes, nose, and veins on the bat instead.

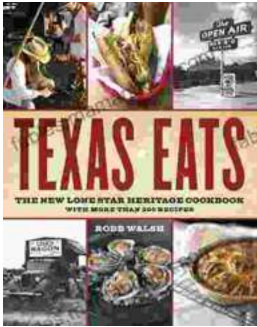

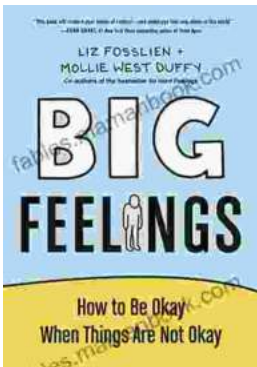
