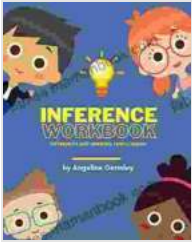

What is an inference?

An inference is a that is drawn from evidence. Inferences can be made about anything, from the weather to the behavior of people. When we make an inference, we are using our knowledge and experience to fill in the gaps in our understanding of the world.

Inferences can be either valid or invalid. A valid inference is one that is supported by the evidence. An invalid inference is one that is not supported by the evidence.

How to draw s

To draw a , we need to first identify the evidence that we have. Once we have identified the evidence, we can start to make inferences about what it means.

When drawing conclusions, it is important to consider the following:

* The strength of the evidence. The stronger the evidence, the more likely it is that the conclusion is valid. * The number of pieces of evidence. The more pieces of evidence that we have, the more likely it is that the conclusion is valid. * The consistency of the evidence. The more consistent the evidence, the more likely it is that the conclusion is valid.

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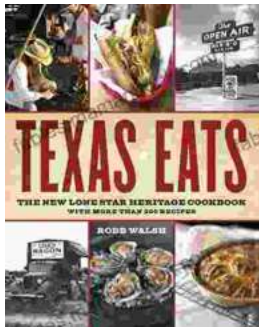
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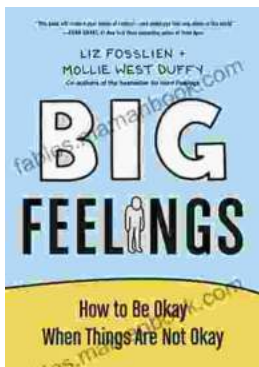
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
